What information is being collected and why?

This website collects and uses personal information for the following reasons:

Contacting us

Should you choose to contact us using the contact form on our Contact page or by corresponding with us by e-mail, telephone or post, none of the data that you supply will be stored by this website or passed to / be processed by any of the third party data processors.

The personal information you provide may include your name, address, e-mail address and telephone number as well as other information about yourself to enable us to provide you with the necessary training.

When you give us information about another person, you confirm that they have appointed you to act for them and to consent to the processing of their personal data.

How will we use the information about you?

We receive and store any information you enter on our website or provide us via email, telephone or post.

We use the information that you provide for such purposes as:

- To provide our service to you (e.g. motorcycle training, advice).
- To disclose the information if required by law.

We will only ever use your personal information to respond to quotation or service requests and provide our motorcycle training services to you.

Who will it be shared with?

We will never sell, rent or otherwise distribute or make public your personal information. Your contact details may be passed on to our approved sub-contractors (whom have signed a data confidentiality agreement) in order for them to contact you about motorcycle training. If you do not wish for a sub-contractor to contact you please make this clear on initial communication with C&A MOTORCYCLE TRAINING.

We will not share your information with any external organisations other than for the above purposes.

Where we store your personal information

The information that we collect from you is stored in a secure database that is separate to our website. The database is hosted on a UK based server. By submitting your personal information, you agree to us storing your information. We will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that your data is treated securely and in accordance with this privacy policy.

Your Rights
